

## Retroactive Placement: Process Checklist

## **Retroactive Placement: Process Checklist**

This document offers a checklist for Retroactive Placement processes. Retroactive Placement should include the following steps:

- Retroactive Placement processes must be established before students are asked to complete them.
- Students currently enrolled in remedial courses should be identified and notified as soon as possible.
- The process as stated below is assumed to be a website where students will enter their information in order to receive a placement.
- The process should include the following elements, presented as steps:
  - 1. Introduction
    - Explaining the process and why students are doing it
    - Listing any information students will need to complete the process
  - 2. Basic Information
    - Name
    - Student ID
    - Birthdate
    - Email
    - College
  - o 3. High School Status
    - Checkboxes noting graduation status within the past 10 years
    - Entry boxes for HiSET or GED scores, if applicable
      - Students may forget scores, so estimations are acceptable
  - o 4. Year and GPA
    - Separated here for clarity, this may be combined with high-school status
    - Year that students graduated from or last attended high-school
    - Most recent high-school GPA
      - GPA estimates may be necessary and are acceptable
  - o 5. Math
    - Allows students to select the last math class they passed
    - Asks students to select a confidence level for their math skills
    - Asks students to select their current math placement
      - This is the main deviation from Guided Self-Placement processes
  - o 6. English
    - Allows students to select the last English class they passed
    - Asks students to select a confidence level for their English skills
    - Asks their current English placement
      - This is the main deviation from Guided Self-Placement processes



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- o 7. Review and Edit
  - Presents students with their collected information
  - Offers the opportunity to review and change any inaccuracies
- o 8. Placement
  - Ideally, placement should be automated and immediately presented to students
  - Students going through this process are likely to be placed in transfer-level courses with concurrent supports
- o 9. Next Steps
  - Final summary of placement results
  - Directions for enrollment
